SUMMIT TOWNSHIP ROAD MILLAGE

Shall the Township of Summit, Jackson County, Michigan, impose an increase of up to 0.5 mill (\$0.50 per \$1,000 of taxable value) in the tax limitation imposed under Article IX, Sec. 6 of the Michigan Constitution and levy it for ten (10) years, 2025 through 2034 inclusive, for the purpose of improving and maintaining local roads in Summit Township, raising an estimated \$446,893 in 2025?

POLICE PROTECTION SERVICES

Shall the previous voted increase in the tax limitations imposed under Article IX, Sec. 6 of the Michigan Constitution in Waterloo Township, of 1.000 mills (\$1.00 per \$1,000 of taxable value), reduced to 0.9934 mills (\$0.9934 per \$1,000 of taxable value) by the required millage rollbacks, be renewed at a reduced amount of 0.75 mills (\$0.75 per \$1,000 of taxable value) and levied for five years, 2026 through 2030, inclusive, for the purpose of providing police protection and public safety services within Waterloo Township, raising an estimated \$133,591.68 in 2026?

**JACKSON PUBLIC SCHOOLS

Shall the Jackson Public Schools, County of Jackson, State of Michigan, borrow the principal sum of not to exceed One Hundred Twenty-Six Million Dollars (\$126,000,000) and issue its unlimited tax general obligation bonds, in one or more series, for the purpose of:

erecting, furnishing and equipping additions to school buildings; remodeling, equipping and reequipping, furnishing and refurbishing school buildings and facilities; acquiring and installing technology and instructional technology equipment for school buildings; and equipping, developing and improving playgrounds, athletic fields and facilities and other facilities, parking areas and sites?

The annual debt millage required to retire all bonds of the School District currently outstanding and proposed pursuant to this ballot is expected to remain at or below 5.95 mills which is an estimated -0- mill increase from the debt millage levied in 2025. The estimated millage that will be levied to pay the proposed bonds in the first year is 3.11 mills (\$3.11 per \$1,000 of taxable value) and the estimated simple average annual millage that will be required to retire each series of the bonds is 3.67 mills annually (\$3.67 per \$1,000 of taxable value). The maximum number of years the bonds may be outstanding, exclusive of refunding, is not more than thirty (30) years.

If approved by the voters, the bonds will be guaranteed by the State under the School Bond Qualification and Loan Program (the "Program"). The School District currently has \$82,520,000 of qualified bonds outstanding and \$0 of qualified loans outstanding under the Program. The School District does not expect to borrow from the Program to pay debt service on these bonds.

The estimated computed millage rate required to be levied to pay the proposed bonds may change in the future based on changes in certain circumstances.

(Pursuant to State law, expenditure of bond proceeds must be audited, and the proceeds cannot be used for teacher, administrator or employee salaries, repair or maintenance costs or other operating expenses.)
